
The Celebration and Blessing of the Marriage of Keegan Trousdale Grace

with your love and concern?

Witnesses: We are.

Then speaking to the whole congregation, the Presider asks

Presider: Will you, their friends and family, do all in your power to support this couple

now, and in the years ahead?

All: We will.

Celebrant This ring is a token of my faithfulness and love,

and a symbol that all I have I share with you.

The Pronouncement The Presider speaks to the couple saying

Presider: Keegan and Leon, you have declared the love you have for each other and your

hopes for the future. You have made promises to each other, and have symbolized them by the joining of hands and the giving of rings.

Keegan and Leon you are now united in marriage.
